AN OVERVIEW

The School-Based Health Center is a unique venture between the Utica City School District and Upstate Family Health Center. With no out of pocket expense to you, the School-Based Health Center provides comprehensive primary health care services exclusively to enrolled students in participating schools. Staffing includes a full time provider, a supervising physician and a full time licensed practical nurse.

HOURS

We offer weekday appointments before, during and after school during the school year. We are closed when school is not in session, including holidays and summer break.

When the health center is closed, students and their families are encouraged to call our main office for medical services.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How do I enroll my child?

Students must attend Donovan Middle School, MLK Elementary or Kernan Elementary School to be eligible to receive services from the School-Based Health Center. Parents must complete an enrollment form to register their child

How much does enrollment cost?

There are no out of pocket expenses to the child or family. The student's health insurance will be billed for services received at the School-Based Health Centers.

What if my child already has a primary care physician?

The School-Based Health Centers will work in collaboration with the current health care provider.

Can I be present when my child attends the SBHC?

Yes. You can attend the visit in person or be on the phone while your child is being seen at the SBHC. We share all findings and results with you after the visit.
